a) HOUSE BILL 2560 – HYBRID MEETINGS LAW

Mr. Latta reviewed his staff report

There was discussion about the various options. It was the consensus of the council to have staff move forward with the recommendation in the staff report.

b) SPECIAL EVENT PERMITS

Mr. Latta reviewed his staff report.

There was brief discussion about ensuring the ability for food trucks to be available. Mr. Latta indicated the special event permit process would likely include work on the itinerant merchant process as well.

It was moved by Councilor Trahan to refer to the Public Administration Committee the task of developing a special event policy for the City of Dallas. The motion was duly seconded by Councilor Hahn and CARRIED with a vote of 9-0 with Councilors Schilling, Briggs, Collins, Crawford, Dunham, Fitzgerald, Hahn, Trahan, and Woods voting YES.

Brian Latta updated the council on the City of Dallas's current drought situation. Mr. Latta mentioned the city is still in stage one drought conditions and mailers went out today to the community. He indicated he'd contacted the schools and the county and they had curtailed their water use by 50%. He noted the city has curtailed water use by 95%. Mr. Latta stated staff is monitoring water levels at the reservoir closely.

Brian reviewed his staff report. He noted we received several proposals and went with Commerce Bank of Oregon with a 1.51% interest rate and no early payoff fees.

A roll call vote was taken and Mayor Dalton declared Resolution 3470 to have PASSED with a vote of 9-0 with Councilors Schilling, Briggs, Collins, Crawford, Dunham, Fitzgerald, Hahn, Trahan, and Woods voting YES.

b) RESOLUTION 3471: A RESOLUTION APPROVING AN APPLICATION TO THE TRANSPORTATION AND GROWTH MANAGEMENT (TGM) PROGRAM OF THE STATE OF OREGON FOR A GRANT TO CONDUCT A FEASIBLITY STUDY AND ANALYSIS REGARDING THE EXTENSION OF MOUNMOUTH CUTOFF ROAD THROUGH THE MILL SITE PROPERTY TO MAIN STREET.
